When is the language study available? Is it a semester long course, does it cost? How long is the course?	Semester long, free of charge for exchange students.	
Are students required to obtain a student visa?	Student visa VITEM IV.	
How and when do exchange/study abroad students register for classes?	A week prior to the start of the classes	
What is the international office assisting students with?	The international office registers the students at the university, briefs the students on administrative procedures after arrival and assigns UnB students to help international students get used to the university.	

What topics will be covered during orientation?	Registration at the university, procedures for foreigners in Brazil, enrollment in courses, Portuguese course procedures and presentation of UnB students who will support international students.
How will students get from housing to class?	Students living on campus housing can go on foot to classes. Others living outside campus will use public transportation, which is free for students who request a student transportation card.
Should students be advised to bring laptop computers?	Not many courses require laptops. Students should use their best judgment in order to establish whether to bring one.
Do students have access to exercise/sports facilities?	There are sports courses and a School of Physical Education that provides some exercise and sports activities.
